Aliya Saperstein is an Associate Professor of Sociology at Stanford University. Her research focuses on the social processes through which people come to receive, name, and deploy seemingly immutable categorical differences-such as race and sex-and how such processes create and maintain social inequality. Her current research projects explore several strands of this subject, including: The implications of methodological decisions, especially the measurement of race/ethnicity and sex/gender in surveys, for studies of stratification and health disparities and the relationship between individual-level category ambiguity or fluidity and the maintenance of group boundaries, stereotypes, and hierarchies. <u>https://sociology.stanford.edu/people/aliya-saperstein</u>
