Taylor Hargrove is an Assistant Professor of Sociology at University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Hargrove's research seeks to uncover and explain the development of health disparities across the life course, focusing on the consequences of race, skin color, gender, and socioeconomic status. Her work addresses both between-group inequalities in health as well as sources of heterogeneity within groups that differentiate pathways to health.
