• Understanding and Mitigating Health Disparities experienced by People with Disabilities caused by Ableism (R01 Clinical Trial Optional) The goal of this NOFO is to encourage research to understand the impact of ableism on health outcomes. Research on the

• <u>CALL FOR PAPERS</u>: Drs. Lesley Tarasoff and Hilary Brown are Co-Guest Editors for a special collection for <u>Archives of Women's Mental Health</u> on Disability and Mental Health Across the Reproductive Life Course. <u>The call for papers can be found here</u>.

We are looking for original research, systematic reviews, and short communications investigating mental health outcomes and mental health care experiences among women with disabilities related to the menstrual cycle, fertility/conception and pregnancy, postpartum and parenting, and the menopausal transition. We will consider quantitative study designs on populations with physical, vision, hearing, and intellectual or developmental disabilities. We encourage the submission of interdisciplinary studies, studies that examine the intersections of ableism and other forms of oppression such as racism, and studies from all global contexts.

b. The submission deadline is November 30, 2023.

• <u>CALL FOR PAPERS: Special Issue on Autism and Aging: A Lifespan Approach in Autism in</u> <u>Adulthood</u>. This special issue will address the dearth of published research on older Autistic adults by focusing on autism and aging. Authors are encouraged to explore Autistic experience in adulthood and later life from a variety of frameworks and approaches, including those that use a biopsychosocial perspective or build upon social or social relational models of disability, rights-based models, the neurodiversity paradigm, or models of social inclusion.

• Caroline Gray, Jacqueline Egelfeld, Anita Vashi, <u>Access to and accessibility of care for</u> <u>rural Veterans with disabilities: A qualitative evaluation of VA healthcare experiences</u>, Disability and Health Journal, 2023

• We conducted 30 qualitative interviews with rural-dwelling Veterans who experience at least one of three types of disabilities: hearing loss, vision loss, and mobility loss. Participants reported experiencing access barriers in five main areas, including policies and operational processes at VA clinics; navigating VA campuses and clinics; limited transportation and parking options; communicating with healthcare personnel and occasional negative interactions; and challenges due to pandemic-related changes in policies and procedures. These findings suggest that Veterans with disabilities may experience a host of challenges and access barriers while navigating the VA Healthcare system. Given its focus on caring for Veterans with service-aggravated conditions and its commitment to equity and inclusion, addressing access barriers among Veterans with disabilities should be a high priority for VA.
